Grant Main was appointed Deputy Minister of the Ministry of Transportation and Infrastructure in March 2011. Before that, Grant served as Deputy Minister of the Ministry of Healthy Living and Sport from June 2008 to October 2010 and Deputy Minister of Community, Sport and Cultural Development from October 2010 to March 2011. Before this, he was with Partnerships BC for six years, where he held the position of Vice-President, Partnerships Services.

Grant has been a member of the British Columbia public service for 20 years and has also held positions with Treasury Board and the Ministries of Finance, Advanced Education, and Economic Development. His career experience ranges from IT and banking to fiscal and economic policy, public private partnerships, and most recently in the areas of active living and sports, public health, arts and culture, and local government. Much of Grant's public service career has been focused on infrastructure policy, budgeting, and project management, delivery and financing.

He is a graduate of Economics from the University of Victoria and recipient of academic, athletic and public service awards. Grant competed in two Olympics, and was a member of the Canadian Olympic men's eights rowing team, which won a gold medal in the 1984 Summer Olympics.
